

Ringgold County Board of Supervisors Minutes
September 4, 2018

The Ringgold County Board of Supervisors met in regular session Tuesday, September 4, 2018. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following members present: Kraig Pennington, Paul Dykstra and Lyle Minnick.

A motion was made by Paul Dykstra and seconded by Lyle Minnick to approve the agenda.

AYES: Unanimous. NAYS: None.

EMA/E911 Director Mel Burton met with the Board to provide department updates. Burton stated she has received the award letter for the FY19 EMPG funds in the amount of \$21,000. She has been completing several E911 sign placements and has been working in the Sun Valley Lake area as well. It was brought to Burton's attention, Schneider's work on the address points project does not correlate with the E911 system. Therefore, it is her recommendation to have Geocom, their current vendor, maintain the address points moving forward. All emergency plans have been updated for various entities and departments as required by code.

Minnick excused himself at 11:30 a.m. for the day.

At 12:00 p.m. the Board recessed for lunch.

At 1:00 p.m. Road Superintendent Rod Shields met with the Board to provide secondary roads updates. Shields stated he continues to work on his work schedule for the department. In light of the recent rain, there are two pipes that need immediate repair. Part of the crew is assessing damages and rock loss around the county. Rock is being hauled to sights and being brought back on the road that was washed off. Overall, the damage was minimal, Shields said. Shields stated he has a few guys hauling farm to market rock to the northwest territory. Dykstra asked if on rainy days, the concrete patch near Longfellow's could be repaired, as well as others on J23. Shields agreed that these patches do need fixed. Shields stated he is tracking the amount of rock lost due to recent rains, should FEMA reimburse the loss. Shields stated mowers are out this week. The total patcher is working on the lake road (220th street) north of Mount Ayr, Shields said. Shields discussed with the Board a project near a bridge north of Redding; this will take approximately a month he said. Dykstra requested a copy of the 2018 Calhoun Burns bridge inspection be on file in the Supervisors office. Pennington asked if the Green culvert project needs to be postponed. Shields stated he would prefer a site on 270th street south of Mount Ayr, however, it is too late to adjust the projects at this point.

The Board reviewed claims for approval which was tabled last week.
