

Ringgold County Board of Supervisors Minutes July 6, 2020

The Ringgold County Board of Supervisors met in regular session Monday, July 6, 2020. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M with the following members present: Kraig Pennington, Ron Landphair and Lyle Minnick.

A motion was made by Pennington, second by Minnick to approve the agenda.

Assistant Engineer Jared Johnson met with the Board to provide secondary roads updates. Pending weather, it is planned to seed and mulch the 240th street project this week. Upon completion, seeding silt fence for ditch checks will be installed.

The patching crew is now making the second trip around the county repairing the smaller holes and pavement edges. The patching crew worked on the lake road North of Mount Ayr. The next road to be worked on is P68, Johnson said.

Mowers have been out making the second round on paved roads. Mowers have been working in the North half of the County.

Patches of bleeding were reported up on the new Sun Valley Lake roads over the weekend. The spots that are bleeding will be addressed today. With high temperatures expected this week, road conditions will continue to be monitored.

Brad England is expected to begin construction of the salt shed the week of July 7th.

WO 519: Replace deteriorated 42" CMP with new straight 42" ADS and revetment flume. Additional fill dirt will be required in order to improve the foreslopes over the culvert. Place revetment at inlet and outlet of culvert. (Complete)

WO 549: Replace damaged out 90" CMP with new 90" CMP. Revetment was placed at the inlet and outlet of the culvert. This is FEMA site 316062. (In Progress)

The Routh Box project is expected to begin the end of September and may continue through the middle of November.

Last week the crew drove the west abutment on the Rice 20 project to plan bearing then began forming and tying reinforcing steel in the west abutment footing. Piling at the east pier were drove and added on. Two of the five east pier pile were drove to plan bearing. The plan for this week is to finish driving pile at the east pier then excavate out the east abutment and drive pile, finish forming the west abutment and pour then begin forming the east abutment.

The Board reviewed the proposed contract for salt in the FY21. The Board moved forward with approval.

The Board reviewed the Madison County Sharing Agreement for the Stephens Bridge project.

County Attorney Clint Spurrier met with the Board to review the Magistrate Appointing Commission process. The Magistrate Appointment Commission in Ringgold County is comprised of one individual as it is based on the number of attorneys within each county, Spurrier explained. The term for the appointee is 6 years. The individual is responsible for appointing the Magistrate within the county. They would also be on the committee to appoint the Associate District Judge if needed. The expected time commitment is three to four days over the six-year term. The Board tabled this appointment until next week.

The Board reviewed claims that were paid June 26, 2020 and July 1, 2020.
